Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated is the oldest historically African-American Greek-lettered sorority, founded January 15, 1908 on the historic campus of Howard University as "Alpha Chapter" in Washington, DC. It is the first Greek-lettered sorority established and incorporated by African-American college-educated women and the AKA Undergraduate Chapter where United States of America Vice President Kamala Harris was initiated. "Pi Chapter" was chartered at Meharry Medical College on April 6, 1921 and moved to the historic campus of Fisk University in 1927.
